Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age National Curriculum

Autumn 1 2022 lead subject: History

New knowledge we will acquire:

- In the old stone age people lived a nomadic life and were hunter-gatherers
- In the new stone age people became farmers and lived in settlements
- Bronze age people wore linen clothes
- Bronze age people ate wild boar, red deer ٠ and pike
- Bronze age people used wooden buckets and clay pots
- Bronze age houses were round houses and had turf rooves
- Bronze is made from copper and tin and it was moulded to make tools and weapons
- Iron age people ate wild animals, berries and bread
- Iron age people believed in many gods
- Iron age people suffered from arthritis

Learning activities we will complete:

- Create a timeline to order stone age to iron age periods.
- Compare early stone age farming to farming now and design a stone age house.
- Explore and investigate artefacts from the bronze age.
- Make a bronze age sword and label when and why bronze age people would use it.
- Visit the local history museum to explore the different eras.
